Poiema Productions presents *Anatolia Speaks*, the brand new one-woman show by acclaimed Canadian playwright, Kenneth Brown (*Spiral Dive* Trilogy, *Letters In Wartime*, *Life After Hockey*). *Anatolia Speaks* is a tale of struggle, passion, and survival when a new Canadian working at Superstore recounts her past in Bosnia to her ESL class. Candice Fiorentino gives a heart-wrenching performance of a play that celebrates the power of the human spirit. *Anatolia Speaks* is playing at the **Nanaimo Centre Stage**, located at 25 Victoria Road. The play is 55 minutes long and tickets are \$20 for adults and \$18 for seniors and students.

Anatolia is a new Canadian immigrant working at Superstore after fleeing wartorn Bosnia. Today, it is her turn to present to her ESL class. She is ever-cheerful and loves her new life but questions about her past reveal a darker story beneath the smile.

Writer, Kenneth Brown, is an actor, director, musician, producer, teacher and playwright. He is the author or co-author of over thirty produced plays; his writing has been produced in five countries in three languages. He has acted in dozens of cities and towns across Canada and abroad, and has directed such hit shows as *Boy Groove*, *Be A Man*, *Sexe-tete*, *Joseph Andrews*, *The Old Curiosity Shop*, *Diamond Dog*, *Cowboy Gothic*, *Letters in Wartime*, and *Spiral Dive*.

Poiema Productions is an Edmonton-based theatre company founded in 2009 by Candice Fiorentino (playing the title role, Anatolia), Melissa Heagy, Brianne Jang and Sara Vickruck. All four are graduates of the Grant MacEwan University Theatre Arts Program, where they met and built a strong friendship based on laughter, love and respect. The four girls envisioned a company based on hard work, solid values and theatre with a purpose. This is the fourth original show they have presented. *Anatolia Speaks* toured to the London and Edmonton Fringes this past summer.
